6 Metro Veterans Representative report

Peter Green raised several issues for a recent Perth Vets Meeting.

The city vets are moving to cashless payment. It was agreed that there was no great urgency.

The issue of women wanting to join in the Country Vets events will need to be considered in light of recent court challenges.

The 2020 Metro v Country Challenge will be held at Bunbury Golf Club on 30th March 2020. An alternative scoring system was being considered, which matched city player against country player and then totaled the number of wins.

The City Vets are reviewing their policy on members joining a low fee club to get a Golfink number and handicap and then using it solely to play in all of the city vets events without playing regularly at their host club. We have two main differences to the City Vets in that only clubs, not individuals are members of Country Vets and also we have only nominations through the clubs and not directly onto the event time sheet. At this stage members generally thought that it was not a real issue for us but that Tim would prepare a position statement to present at the AGM.

We do not have a severe weather policy and it was thought that each club needed to have the policy and that common sense should prevail. (Who is going to risk a potential lightning strike because they might win a golf ball by continuing to play? Sec)

The AGVU only meet once a year and there is a perception that they are becoming irrelevant. City vets are preparing a discussion paper for future debate.
